Our Consistory at Work - Consistory Notes from November 9, 2021

- Brenda Smith-Cliffe led devotions based on Ecclesiastes 3... "For everything there is a season". The season we live in seems to be filled with anger. We must slow down, remember our plans are not God's plans, and ask Him to watch over us, guide us, forgive us and help us to walk in His light in these troubled times.
- As of Nov. 21st, there will be no limit on how many people can attend worship.
- The Food Pantry provided 7,635 meals during the month of October. Wednesday hours are 2:30-5:00 pm.
- Treasurer's October report: Total YTD revenue: \$191,554.03. Total YTD expenses: \$264,863.93. There is concern about diminished congregational giving. Total income has been propped up by the government PPP loan this year. Significant property repairs/issues raised total YTD expenses. Finance Committee is creating the 2022 budget based on the pledges that have been received. Investments continue to do well.
- Deacons' Thanksgiving offering to benefit Southern Dutchess Coalition for the Homeless.
- Consistory approved offering position of Food Pantry Director to Kristin Cullen, a volunteer whose work with the FP plus experience as nutritionist and dietician are excellent qualifications for position. We are very grateful to Rich Lanni for his hard work and dedication as interim director over the last few months.
- Pastor Amy will lead online Advent Bible study Wednesdays in December. It will focus on Nativity story as told in the synoptic gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke.
- Confirmation classes are being planned for January or February, possibly at Warwick. Five youth have expressed interest in attending.
- Youth Group under the leadership of Pia Price will hold first meeting Nov. 14. They will make "Advent to Go" boxes for the youngest Sunday School children!
- SDCH continues to distribute food bags through the library. Please contact Phyllis Lake if you know someone who needs one.
- Property Committee updates:
- -New snow removal contractor(s) being sought to remove snow on sidewalks, parking lots and driveways.
- -The Education building boiler work has been completed; the fire alarm system repaired; new generator installed in Food Pantry; automatic sterilizers, soap and paper towel dispensers installed in church buildings; and three portable filtration systems installed in sanctuary (to help lower the risk of aerosol spread).
- -Contractors have been contacted to make repairs to DuBois porch steps and ramp, sanctuary gutters, wrought iron fences in cemetery; and parsonage.
- -Safety cones will be put on horse stage stop until repairs can be made in Spring.
- -Ten windows in the Education Building need to be replaced in order to meet safety code requirements.
- -Due to safety concerns with lighting commercial ovens in kitchen, we hope to replace them with one or two large, user-friendly ovens to meet our needs more safely. Sale of existing ovens is possible.
- -Addition of crash bars on sanctuary doors to ensure the safety of congregation is being explored. A company which did previous work for us has been contacted, to ensure historical feel and beauty of sanctuary is not compromised, while still providing security for those who gather. The need for additional safety is a sad and unfortunate aspect of our current times, but one that we can't ignore.

In-Person Worship

As of Nov. 21st, there will be no limit on how many people can attend worship. Masks and distancing are still required. Vaccinated children may attend. Children too young for vaccination (under age 5) may also attend. Masks will be required for children over 2. An Elder will be at the door to check vaccine cards and medical exemptions for first time attendees. We hope to be able to resume Coffee Hour soon as well!

The current plan is:

- Participants must wear mask covering both mouth and nose throughout the service
- Participants must contact the office to sign up to attend the service (*by 12 noon*, *Friday*) so we will know how many and who will attend (for potential contact tracing purposes)
- Participants must be fully vaccinated, showing proof at first visit unless they can show doctor's note stating medical exemption.

Meet our new Fishkill Food Pantry Director:



Hi friends.

Covid is catalyzing us to rethink the way we reach, serve and invite our friends into the life of the community. One unforeseen benefit of connecting online along with children's ministry videos from my wife Florence is that now our skeptical, "spiritual but not religious" friends can access the life of the community and hear the gospel from anywhere, at any time. And they are!

For example: at a concert in a main plaza in downtown San Diego, I was amazed by the headlining musician named Blaise, who captivated the crowd at this outdoor concert. A mutual friend introduced me to Blaise between sets. He smiled and exclaimed, "I already know who you are. You're Pastor Matt! I've been a part of Renew Church online for several months and it has reconnected me to Christ. This has been so good for me that I'm sharing it with my mom!" This began a pastoral relationship with Blaise as he is reuniting with God, reconnecting with community and finding deeper meaning in his music as he shares God's creativity and beauty with the world. This story signifies a larger theme: God is at work in ways we see and thousands of ways we don't.



During the peak of Covid when we were only able to meet online, a single mother with chronic health needs joined the Renew Community. She became connected to the church through online worship services, Zoom community groups, and pastoral phone calls. Though we hadn't yet met in person, the church was able to financially and emotionally support this amazing woman when she lost her housing and faced homelessness. Now, she is in safe housing with a community of people surrounding her as she addresses challenges with hope.

We recently hired a phenomenal woman named Jordan Mageo, who is the first full-time hire on Renew's ministry team besides myself! Jordan is strengthening our capacity to reach out to our neighbors through her online/social media background and is enriching the worship experience Sundays through her musical talent. This "hire for growth" is an act of faith which is possible largely because of your financial support of Renew Church. I hope you feel joy and a sense of partnership as you hear about the increased ways Renew is serving as an outpost of resurrection light and life! Jordan's husband, Brian is joining our ministry team in a part-time role to develop a youth group for the growing number of older children in the community. He's also a brilliant musician and a deep theological thinker working on dual Master's degrees in Theology and Divinity. Brian adds to the depth of our ministry, and I'm honored to help shape and develop him in these early stages of his ministry calling!
