Sept. 18th - Oct. 30th is Stewardship month. Here are the activities we have planned:

On Oct. 2, We will steward the abundance of food we have been given and begin a canned soup drive for the food pantry that will run through the month of October

On Oct. 9, we will steward the land we are given and collect vegetable seeds so we can begin our garden in the Spring. Food from the garden will be given to the food pantry so recipients will have fresh vegetables we have grown for them and to church members who may want them. Volunteers will be able to sign up on this day to help with the garden next spring.

October 16 is Consecration Sunday. On this day, we will hear the stories of some folks who have multiplied their \$40 for the church and how God used what they were given to make even more for the kingdom. This will be the day to make your pledges for the coming year.

October 23, we will hear more stories about the multiplication of resources.

Meeting Notes from September 13th, 2022

Heather Hansen led devotions based on Psalm 23 and Philippians 4:7. Life gives us so many opportunities to reflect on the message of God's peace that Psalm 23 offers us and to take comfort in its words. There is no force in the universe as powerful as God's love, and the knowledge of God's love and presence is sufficient to carry us through each day!

Our thanks to the many committed volunteers and our Director at the Food Pantry who continue to meet the growing need for assistance in our area. Their daily presence and the extra effort at fundraisers such as the Beacon Farm Market, Shoprite collection, and the Stormville Flea Market make a big difference in many lives!

As part of the Stewardship activities planned for September, envelopes containing money and ideas to be used towards raising funds for our church's needs have been distributed to church members. We hope your creativity and energy will be fruitful!

Pastor Amy will begin a (Zoom) Bible Study of the Acts of the Apostles on Wednesday evenings at 7 pm beginning October 5th MS.

The Outpour Center in Jackson, MS has expressed its gratitude for our donation of \$1,000 (plus incoming donations from our congregation) towards the collection and distribution of bottled water for their residents affected by the recent devastating floods.

A letter is being sent to the Mid-Hudson Classis requesting approval to have extra assessment waived to allow us to pursue dual affiliation with the UCC without members of our congregation incurring the financial burden. New Paltz and other churches have already received this exemption, so we believe there is a fair precedent for this request.

Consistory approved the appointment of Janie Koopmans as our new Choir Director, effective as of Oct. 1st. We welcome Janie back with gratitude and anticipation of many more beautiful choruses filling our sanctuary!

The Christian Education Committee will be meeting to discuss what type of Sunday School program will best meet the needs of our families. We hope to see this as an opportunity for change, with new ideas that will be suited to our current numbers of children as well as any new students who may arrive. The Sunday School program will begin in October...more information will follow!

Treasurer's August report: Total YTD revenue: \$150,019.69; Total YTD expenses: \$219,045.51.

Property Committee updates: Painting of the fence surrounding the Ed building has been completed; problems with door mechanisms on the Ed building and shed door are being corrected; a crash bar will be added to the kitchen door; Doyle Security will add a fire alarm and smoke detector systems to the sanctuary; B&L Property Mgt will provide service for snow removal and lawn cutting on the church grounds and will power wash and clean the gutters at the parsonage. Our plan of action to remove and replace the mounting block outside the sanctuary is awaiting information about Zoning regulations. Numerous offers for help in removing and replacing the block have been made, and Toni Houston is researching what type of structure will be historically correct and appropriate.

We will get the money to the correct place

4. Make sure you have signed your check.

FIRST REFORMED CHURCH'S MISSIONS

Our Church Sponsored RCA Missionaries

Once every five years, all the racial/ethnic councils plan their gatherings at the same place so they can have an overlapping joint session, all together. That happened two weeks ago in Chicago, and I got to be there. It was [the first time the Council for Native American Indigenous Ministries met since being reconstituted](#) at General Synod in June. (Absolute favorite moment of the joint session: hearing this group sing "I Have Decided to Follow Jesus" in Apache, and all the rest of us join in on the fourth verse.) The African American Black Council was there, too, as the Hispanic Council, and the Council for Pacific and Asian American Ministries. It was a beautifully diverse group. Leaders from the councils shared powerful stories and testimonies of God at work in their lives and their churches. Driving home, I was buoyed up by the stories I'd heard and the conversations I'd had. In the last few years, we've heard a lot about the RCA's multicultural, multiracial future freed from racism. At this gathering, it was clear that Revelation 7:9, with all tribes and tongues and peoples and nations, gathered around the throne of God, is not just the future—it's the present. We've been longing for this in the RCA for some time now. Since General Synod 2008 added a multiracial future component to Our Call, the big 10-year goal at the time. Since the Decade Freed from Racism initiative was adopted in 1998. Since the formation of the first racial/ethnic council in 1969. Perhaps much earlier than that, even. And look at what God has done and is doing! That's worth a pause today to celebrate and give thanks.
