#### From Pastor Amy

We are people who like to be independent and take care of ourselves. We like to believe our perspectives are the correct and valid ones. We don't like to ask for help or admit we need it. That is the culture we live in, but it is not the culture Christ intended for the church. We are to be different from the world. We are to be interdependent—we need one another. We are meant to care for one another, not from a position of offering charity, but from a position of family, knowing that one day we will need help too. We are meant to share what we have and make decisions for the good of the whole community, not just ourselves. It goes against the culture we live in, and that is the point; we are supposed to look different. We are supposed to live in love together, and that takes effort. It can be hard work, especially for those of us who like our independence and don't want to feel like we "owe" anyone anything.

The church is meant to be a place of mutual interdependence where each member is incomplete without the other, where the suffering of one is the suffering of all, and where rejoicing for one is rejoicing for the community. This also means that conflict between members affects not only those individuals; it affects the whole community. Even for those who may not be aware of the conflict, its presence in the community impacts the whole community. We experience it in different ways. In tense rooms, in sudden disappearances, in lost relationships. Because we are bound together in Christ, the disunity of a few is the disunity of all. What makes us different as Christians is not that we don't argue or disagree or hurt one another—we all know that happens. What makes us different is HOW we address and resolve the issues when they arise. We aren't supposed to have conflict like the world does by yelling, slandering, gossiping about, ignoring, or shaming one another, but neither are we to sweep our problems under the rug as if they don't exist; instead, Jesus calls us to the harder thing-reconciliation - and provides us with a way to carry that out when disagreements inevitably arise.

We are called to a ministry of forgiveness and reconciliation, but sometimes we forget a step. We may ask one another for forgiveness, but we don't expect repentance from ourselves or others. By asking the injured person to forgive without asking the one who has caused harm to repent, we put the responsibility for the situation on the one who has been hurt and don't acknowledge the source of that pain. Even if forgiveness is expressed, it is not genuine if the wound is not acknowledged, and the injured person will not be able to trust the community to keep him or her safe in the future.

Disagreement will always be part of community life. We can choose to see it as negative and refuse to engage or engage in hurtful ways, or we can see it as an opportunity to learn and grow stronger in our faith and our community.

This Thanksgiving, may we give thanks for the people in our lives, for the church community we have, and for a God who offers us grace, love, and mercy every day. May we all know the love we have in Christ and share that love with everyone we meet.




## **Our Consistory at Work**

Consistory Notes from October 11, 2022, for November Parish Visitor

- Greg Totino led devotions based on Matthew 16:26. An important aspect of our calling as Christians and leaders is to be careful that our debates and arguments are meant to solve problems, not to create drama or gain power or a sense of importance. Addressing problems and meeting the needs of others is how, instead of finding joy in the argument, we can find joy in the solution. Anything that we're trying to achieve is possible through God.
  - Let us pray: As we hear arguments without solutions, let us be the ones who find solutions through Christ, who gives us strength.
- Pastor Amy's first (Zoom) Bible Study of the Acts of the Apostles was well-attended and will continue on Wednesday evenings at 7 p.m.
- The income from the Everything Sale was \$1,415.98. Thank you to everyone whose hard work and donations made the return of this endeavor a success!
- The final profit from the Golf Outing to support the Building and Grounds projects was over \$9,200...a wonderful bonus for an afternoon of good company, fresh air, and fun! Thank you for the organization and participation that always make this outing a huge success!
- Our congregation's additional donation of \$855 for the Outpour Center in Jackson, MI, towards the distribution of bottled water to local flood victims was acknowledged by Pastor Thompson... "Your kindness and compassion have ministered to us in unspeakable ways, and we are eternally grateful for your partnership in the gospel."
- Receipt of our letter to the Mid-Hudson Classis, requesting approval to have the additional assessment waived to allow us to pursue dual affiliation with the UCC, has been acknowledged, but we have not yet received a response.
- The numbers in our choir are growing, and the sanctuary is filled with beautiful voices guided by our new director, Janie Koopmans, and the lovely music provided by Christine Johannsen. Our thanks for the joy they all add to our worship!
- Treasurer's September report: Total YTD revenue: \$161,407.36; Total YTD expenses: \$247,838.84
- Property Committee updates: Taggart Lake's work on repairing 6 to 8 headstones has already made a difference in the appearance of our church cemetery. In reviewing the names on the cemetery stones, Toni Houston has found quite a few more veterans who will be receiving flag markers in the future. The Ed building will receive two new Exit sign/emergency light fixtures and minor electrical work on some light fixtures and outlets.
- We thank Rich and B.J. Lanni for faithfully leading the church's mission to provide hundreds of meals for Webster house, and we now welcome Helene Wright and Ginny Stiles to take over supervision of this much-appreciated service.


